

From Granada to Competa (approx 2 hours)

You start at the green marker on the map below. Out of airport take the exit for **Granada/Santa Fe**. Keep in the inside lane then take the first exit right signposted **La Malaha**.

Stay on this road over roundabouts following signs for Otura (might also say Motril). When you reach the main roundabout for motorway follow signs for Motril. The motorway will take towards Granada, around its edge and then South towards the coast. After Granada the road passes Lanjaron, the Alpujarras mountains and Lecrin valley. The motorway is of good quality and is normally only busy for a few junctions around Granada. After 45 mins you will reach the end of the motorway and the coast.



Keep going until you see signs for Salobrena/Málaga (right turn onto the main coast road), the yellow marker on the map above. Stay on the coast road passing through Salobrena, Almunecar and La Herradura. After La Herradura take the new motorway signposted Málaga onto motorway.

You are now about 40 minutes away from Competa. Just after the exits for Nerja you see signs for the Torrox/Competa exit. Follow signs to Competa.

From Competa to Granada Airport

Turn off M/way at Otura/La Malaha Jnt
Left around r/about following signs for La Malaha
Straight on at every r/about until you pick signs up for Santa Fe
Straight on again until you reach the end by m/way
Turn right onto m/way BUT keep in inside lane for approx 200 yds this will take you off the m/way you will come to a small r/about
Go right around the r/about and back under the bridge then the first left which will take you back onto the m/way going the other way
Airport will be signposted (be careful as it looks like the sign is pointing to the first exit it's the second one).
